We couldn't lick alcohol with our own remaining and resources we accepted further the fact that dependence upon a higher power (if only our A.A. group) could to this hitherto impossible job. The moment we were able to fully accept these facts, our release from alcohol compulsion has begun. For most of us this pair of acceptances had required a lot of exertion to achieve. Our whole philosophy treasured of selfsufficiency had to be cast aside. This had not been done with old-fashioned willpower; it was instead a matter of developing the willingness to accept these new facts of living.
